

# Chhattisgarh aims to provide international standard education to school students: CM

**RAIPUR, NOV 14 /--/** Chhattisgarh chief minister Bhupesh Baghel today said government schools in the state will be run as per international standards to provide quality education to students on the lines of the Swami Atmanand Government English Medium Schools, also known as SAGES.

He said the state government will also set up 'Balwadi' (kindergarten schools) for children above three years of age. The CM made these announcements under the 'Chhattisgarh school education vision document 2030' while addressing the opening ceremony of the two-day Jawaharlal Nehru Rashtriya Shiksha Samagam, a congregation of educationists and innovative teachers

being held here to mark the birth anniversary of the country's first prime minister.

"On the lines of Swami Atmanand Government English Medium Schools (SAGES), (government) schools will be run in the state as per international standard to provide quality education to children. There should be schools of international level so that students from the state could shine at the international platform and bring laurels to the state, Baghel said.

The state government had launched the SAGES scheme in November last year under which government Hindi medium schools were renovated and modernized into English medium schools. As many as 171 SAGES are being run in



the state. Pre-primary education will be provided to children above three years of age by operating 'balwadi'. We will do it by 2030.

Besides, employment oriented education will be provided to the students of Classes IX to XII so that children can acquire skills in any particular discipline

along with their studies, he added. Briefing about how the idea of starting English medium schools was conceptualized, Baghel said it was found during discussions amid the COVID-19 pandemic that the state did not have a hospital where an IAS officer and his family could go for treatment and nor does it have a school where IAS and IPS officials can send their children for studies. "State School Education Minister Premsai Singh Tekam and Education department principal secretary Alok Shukla accepted the challenge and the decision was taken to start SAGES. It was started with three schools in Raipur and now there are 171 SAGES across the state," the CM said.

Speaking on the occa-

sion, Congress spokesperson Gaurav Vallabh said Nehru's concept was based on scientific temperament which is not there in the incumbent Union government. Nehruji's 'parikalpana' (hypothesis/concept) was the concept of scientific temperament. Unfortunately the concept of incumbent Central government is not of scientific temperament. In the concept of scientific temperament, you have the power to question 'why'. If I am giving a speech here, then my fellow teachers (referring to audiences) can ask why are you speaking this. This was the concept which Nehruji gave to the country," he said. Nehru gave the concept of equity, inclusiveness, democracy and constitution, he added. (PTI)

## Dudhwa National Park to reopen today

**LAKHIMPURKHERI, NOV 14 /--/** The Dudhwa National Park is set to open for tourists from November 15, a senior official said today.

Dudhwa Tiger Reserve (DTR) Field Director Sanjay Kumar Pathak said tourists wishing to visit the rhino area in south Sunaripur range will have to wait for a few days more as the rhino area is still swampy and not fit for elephant movements. "As per government directives, the Dudhwa National Park would now be opened for tourists from November 15. However, due to heavy water-logging still prevailing in Sathiyana, the area would not be allowed for tourist activities till further instructions, he said.

The park was earlier scheduled to open from November 1. However, untimely heavy rains, unprecedented discharge of 5,33,000 cusecs of water into the Sharda river from Banbasa barrage that flooded Mohana and Suheli rivers passing through Dudhwa National Park disturbed the schedule. Pathak said, "elderly persons over 60 years of age would have to (mandatorily) produce their vaccination certificates on entering the Dudhwa National Park area, while other tourists between 18 to 60 years of age may be randomly asked to produce their

certificates." He added every tourist must follow Covid protocols while visiting the park. Located on the India-Nepal border, the Dudhwa National Park attracts tourists, wildlife enthusiasts and researchers every year with its untouched natural habitat, rich grasslands, wetlands and a vast population of wild life species. It is home to Royal Bengal tigers, wild tuskers, 400 species of birds, five species of deer including swamp deer, various species of reptiles, medicinal plants and vegetation. (PTI)

## AP CM seeks committee to resolve inter-state issues

**TIRUPATI, NOV 14 /--/** Andhra Pradesh chief minister Y S Jagan Mohan Reddy today requested the Centre to constitute a committee under the chairmanship of the Union home minister to resolve inter-state issues in a time-bound manner.

In his inaugural address at the 29th Southern Zonal Council meeting in this temple-town, the Chief Minister regretted that all issues between AP and Telangana remained unresolved even seven years after the state was bifurcated.

"For the country's overall development, the robustness of the Centre-State and inter-state relations is of paramount importance. I, therefore, emphasise the need to work towards a mechanism that ensures amicable and time-bound settlement of issues that exist between the parties," Reddy said.

The chief minister referred to several issues en-

shrined in the AP Reorganisation Act, 2014, including the grant of special category status to the state, that still remained unresolved, causing "immense economic hardships and deprivation." "The state bifurcation was conditional on the commitment to accord Special Category Status. However, despite the passage of several years, that key commitment is yet to be honoured," he regretted.

"Post-bifurcation of the erstwhile state of Andhra Pradesh in 2014, the newly formed state of Telangana and the successor state of AP have several bifurcation-related issues that are yet to be resolved. Long pendency of these issues would not only force the states to endure a huge economic loss, but also have the potential to strain the relationship between the states," Reddy said. He said it was imperative that a suitable solution emerged and

the issues were addressed at the earliest.

The chief minister referred to the Centre's failure to bridge the resource gap for AP, approve the revised cost estimate for the Polavaram multipurpose project, complete the legal division of assets valued approximately at Rs 1,42,601 crore, as listed in Schedules 9 and 10 of the APRA, 2014. "This is hampering their functioning and resulting in adverse impact for the state. The Central government's urgent intervention with respect to these matters is crucial to safeguard the interests of AP," the chief minister said.

The chief minister said the Telangana power distribution companies owed an amount of Rs 6,112 crore to the AP Power Generation Corporation for power supplied from June 2014 to June 2017. The Union government "compelled" AP to supply power to Telangana but now the latter has taken a stand that the amount would be paid along with the demerger plan for electricity utilities. "Since the power supply was based on the Centre's stand, I request its intervention for resolution of the problem as the AP Genco is financially

stressed and struggling to meet its debt servicing requirement," he added.

Referring to another inter-state issue, the chief minister said AP has been supplying water to Tamil Nadu "as and when requested" to meet the drinking water needs of Chennai city. The Tamil Nadu government owed Rs 338.48 crore for the past ten years for infrastructure and cost associated with operation and maintenance of Telugu Ganga project. "I request that suitable steps be taken to settle this amount at the earliest," Reddy said.

The chief minister pointed to the "inadequate

coverage" of beneficiaries under the National Food Security Act, which "continues to trouble the state." He said only 2.68 crore people were covered under the Targeted Public Distribution System, which was 61 and 41 per cent of rural and urban population respectively. "This is grossly inadequate, considering the fact that at the national level 75 per cent of rural and 50 per cent of urban population is covered under TPDS. States like Gujarat, Maharashtra and Karnataka with robust public finances have at least 10 per cent more coverage than AP," he pointed out. (PTI)

## Man, daughter dead as truck rams into cars on Jammu-Srinagar highway

**BANIHAL/JAMMU, NOV 14 /--/** A man and his three-year-old daughter died today and his wife was critically injured when a truck rammed several vehicles on the Jammu-Srinagar national highway, police said. The Kashmir-bound truck hit four cars coming from the opposite side near Magerkote in Ramban district, they said. The deceased were identified as Jatinder Singh (33) of Tral and his minor daughter Navdeep Kaur, a police official said. Singh's wife Rimple

Kaur (30) was hospitalised with critical injuries, he said. Seven more people escaped with minor injuries, the official said, adding that the driver of the truck abandoned his vehicle and fled the scene. A case was registered and efforts are on to arrest him, he said. The official said preliminary investigations suggested break failure caused the truck driver to lose control over the vehicle. Meanwhile, the officials said 35-year-old Uttar Pradesh resident Ashu, who was among 12 people injured in a separate road accident on the highway on Saturday, succumbed to injuries at a hospital, taking the death toll in the incident to three.
